DRONE SURVEY (Feb?)

- Task 1: specialist contractor to carry out UAS (drone) geospatial survey to produce 3D model, elevation and plan orthophotos of standing remains of castle
- Task 2: specialist contractor to carry out landscape earthwork UAS (drone) geospatial survey of up to 25ha of earthworks to south of castle and in 'axe field'
- Task 3: specialist contractor to carry out landscape earthwork GIS analysis of outputs and produce interpretation report
- Awarded £5,000 from CWAAS (Cumberland and Westmorland Antiquarian and Archaeology Society)


